## Morning / End of the day routines

Please ensure that your child arrives in school between 8:50 – 9:00am. The teachers start the morning task from 8:50 and then register at 9:00. When children come into school at 8:50 they use the time to respond to the teachers marking. If they miss this they are missing out on valuable learning experiences.

Lessons then begin promptly at 9:05. It can be disrupting for the class if a child comes in after this time. Thank you for your support with this.

We will continue to review the early pick up policy, as we acknowledge that at times this has not gone as smoothly as hoped. The school is under no obligation to allow children to leave before the end of the day, which is 3:30. Assemblies are an important part of the curriculum and may sometimes run over their allocated time. A final decision as to whether the early pick up continues will be made for summer 2018.

The children arrived back in September looking very smart. Please continue to support us by ensuring your child/ children have the correct uniform. It is vital that all children have their PE kits in school very day as PE is part of the curriculum and children need to have the correct kit to participate.

## **Safeguarding**

In school, we take our duty of care very seriously for all our pupils. We work hard to ensure that pupils in school are in a safe environment. All our staff are trained to ensure we have the highest levels of safeguarding and are always on hand to listen to children if they are concerned about things. However, this may not be the case for some children once they are out of the school environment. Over the holiday period or, at any time, if you have a concern regarding the well-being of a child - any child - then you, as members of the public, also have a duty of care to that child. If you are in any doubt about what that child is experiencing or have any concerns regarding how safe they are, please ring the Multi Agency Safeguarding (MASH) where you can talk to someone about your concerns and ensure that a child will be supported.
