AUTUMN 1 CURRICULUM INFORMATION FOR NURSERY



Welcome to Dinnington First School Nursery. I am sure we are going to have a fantastic year together.

The first two weeks gradual introduction into Nursery will allow the children to find their feet and become familiar with their surroundings and our routines. We are always aware of the differing abilities and attitudes within the class, and remain flexible as to the needs of the individual. Please remember we are always available to discuss any worries you may have concerning your child settling in or his/her development.

As the children settle in this half term we work towards a number of targets that we feel most children should meet. For example, become familiar with adults and peers and their learning environment, interact with their peers, understand to wait for a turn and share, select preferred resources and activities but be willing to try others, follow routines and co-operate with the boundaries that are set. Children will be asked to answer their name at registration, join in a group singing and rhyme session, sit and listen to a story each day, follow simple instructions and communicate with others effectively. We will encourage and support each child towards these targets and beyond for those who are able, always seeing each child as an individual.

The first theme we will follow is titled 'Who Am I' Children will discuss and talk about who is in their family using their own family photographs. We will look at how we have changed since we were babies. Children will learn to name and point to different parts of the body and we will discuss the different feelings we have had.

We will send home a nursery rhyme booklet containing a selection of rhymes that we will be following in Nursery; for you and your child to sing together. Nursery rhymes introduce children to the idea of storytelling and can help language development. They also lay the foundation for learning to identify rhyme, rhythm and sounds in words.

During week three children will take part in weekly Debutots sessions in the hall. These sessions focus on learning through story, drama and play.

To develop our maths skills we will song lots of number rhyme songs and count to 10 (and beyond) daily, count groups of objects and learn to represent numbers to 5 using our fingers. The children will watch and use Ten Town resources which focus on number recognition through stories, songs and games.

Physically we hope children will hold a paint brush and pencil and use them in the best way they can, use large tweezers to strengthen their fine motor coordination, attempt cutting with scissors, communicate their need for the toilet, begin to manage their own clothes in the bathroom, handle small and large construction equipment and be willing to climb and jump off equipment safely.

Finally, please make sure your child has a change of clothes in a named bag and also ensure that toys are left at home unless we ask for specific items linked to the theme we are following. Please make sure your child has a coat and suitable outdoor clothing as they will have the opportunity to do outdoor activities.
