ATTENDANCE



Attendance Expectations:

It is vital for all children to attend school to minimise, as far as possible, the longer-term impact of the pandemic on children's education, wellbeing and wider development.

Missing out on more time in the classroom risks pupils falling further behind. Those with higher overall absence tend to achieve less well in both primary and secondary school.

School attendance has been mandatory from 8th March 2021.

Attendance expectations from the WSCC Compliance and Pupil Entitlement Office include the ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with the local authorities code of conduct.
