<p>To ensure the participation in school swimming to enable all children to be able to swim at least 25m by the end of year 6</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All children from Year3 –Year 6 are offered between 10 and 20 weeks of ½ hour swimming lessons given by trained swimming teachers at Ships and Castles Leisure Centre</li> <li>• In cases of financial hardship payment for transport , pool hire and instruction of swimming lessons will ensure all children can swim at least 25m by the end of year 6</li> </ul>	<p>Transport and swimming instructor costs</p>	<p><b>Unfortunately, due to Ships and Castles being closed for 6 months, swimming was offered to Year 3 and 4 for only the summer term.</b></p>
