The Ordo appears a little confused next weekend as it is both “Racial Justice Sunday” and the “Day of Prayer for the Unemployed”. We shall make one the intention at Mullion, the other at Helston.

Could we please make sure there are names on the list in the porch **to steward ALL our masses**. If there aren’t then the church should remain locked!

ASH WEDNESDAY, February 17th. Public Mass at 10.00 in Helston; 11.30 in Mullion.

There will be a public mass at Mullion on Tuesdays at 10.00 during Lent, beginning Tuesday, 23rd Feb.

Please read Fr Brian's comments about how we are going to administer **ashes on Ash Wednesday** this year, so that you won't be taken by surprise (or wear your best hat!). This is how it has always been done on the continent and the Church of England has also instructed its ministers to do it this way this year.

In this bulletin Father Brian announces he will be doing **Stations of the Cross** from Falmouth through the parish website. I suggest we all tune in to that, rather than doing "our own thing" here in Helston & Mullion. I have the booklets available on request.

Lent 2021

Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, 17th February. Mass will be celebrated at 10.00 am at Falmouth. There will be the traditional blessing of the Ashes. However, the ashes will not be distributed in the usual way. This year the ashes will not be placed on your heads but rather sprinkled on your heads in silence, as you approach the priest as you would for holy communion.

Stations of the Cross

Each Friday of Lent Father Brian will lead the Stations of the Cross, beginning on **19th February** at 6.30 pm. Because of the current restrictions the Stations will be live-streamed using the ‘Live Mass’ link on the parish website. To help you participate Father Brian will use the Saint Alphonsus Stations of the Cross every week during Lent. Copies of the booklet of these stations are available in the churches at Falmouth and Mawnan Smith for you to take and keep. We have obtained 50 extra copies plus 10 large print copies. So please feel free to take a copy when you come to Mass. To those who are not attending Mass at the moment but would like a copy of the stations please contact the parish and we will do our best to get a booklet to you. Presentation by Father Brian

Tuesdays 16th February and 23rd February at 6.30 pm

Presentation by Fr Brian on 'Jesus Outside of the New Testament' – how Jesus was written about by non-Christians in the early days of the Church. Feast Day of St Josephine Bakhita and World Day of Prayer Against Human Trafficking

Monday is the Feast of St Josephine Bakhita, who was canonised in 2020. She is the patron saint of survivors of human trafficking. At the age of seven, she was kidnapped and sold into slavery, beaten and tortured. Eventually, she was taken to Italy; her owners wanted to take her back to Africa, but the courts declared her a free person. Eventually, she became a Catholic and was a nun for 45 years.

Pope John Paul II, said; "We find her a shining advocate of genuine emancipation. The history of her life inspires us with a resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence and return them to their full dignity."

Owned by the Catholic Diocese of Westminster and managed by Caritas, Bakhita House in London, provides women escaping from human trafficking, with the safety and support they need to begin the recovery process. As well as providing a safe temporary home, women are offered a range of services including emotional, legal and financial support.

CAFOD works as an advocate for Human Rights. In Bangladesh alone, 100,000 poor girls and women go abroad each year, to earn money for their families' survival; mainly to India and Saudi Arabia. Of these 50% are subjected to physical and psychological abuse.

CAFOD is supporting the development of OKUP, an organisation that helps them return home, restore their dignity and assist them in rehabilitation and recovery of their livelihood, e.g., by buying a cow.

Jan 28th Ethiopia Hundreds of people are being killed in the conflict in Tigray. Shops, Churches, and Convents, are being looted and destroyed.

Jan 28th Syria A father cannot buy his child an anorak because an anorak is equivalent to his monthly wage. Syria is beginning to be forgotten. The civil war, Covid-19, and new government sanctions are causing much distress.

Sr Anne quotes; "Many times we receive calls, people are hungry, they have nothing to wear. Life without gas and electricity is very hard. There is no gas to cook food or electricity to warm a house"

Nigeria Bishop Oliver Doeme of Maiduguri, speaking after the massacre and destruction of Christian villages said;

"Our faith is being stronger. 100 people were baptised in one parish on Christmas Eve. As long as the Kingdom of God continues, no evil will overcome it"
