


## **NEWSLETTER 6**

As I write this the scaffolding that has adorned our school for what seems like months is finally coming down. The new roof is finished and we can now be confident that the school will remain warm and dry.



As part of the project we have been able to add several new light tunnels in the darker parts of the school. In particular we now have natural light in the reception area and Mrs Monk is finally able to switch the lights off and still be able to see to work!

We have also had the school garden area remodelled and new raised beds put in. I am really looking forward to the weather really warming up so the children can get outside and start planting and growing a range of plants. We even have space for a greenhouse in the new garden area. We are really grateful to the FPSA who have kindly agreed to purchase this addition to the garden area.

Over the Easter holidays a new canopy will be erected at the side of Vivaldi class. This covered area will house a new mud kitchen and an area where bikes can be stored. This project has been in the pipeline for a long time and we have finally got planning permission allowing us to go ahead.



Where possible we like to support local businesses. Tony from Trax in Buntingford came over with a few sample bikes to make sure we ordered exactly the right bikes to ensure all our younger children have access to a bike that is the correct size for them. At the same time we purchased some cycle helmets so that the children learn right from the start the importance of wearing a cycle helmet whenever they are on a bike.


### Pancake races

We had great fun on Friday supporting Sport Relief 2018.




The children from the School Council set up and officiated over an obstacle course around the school field track. Everyone took part and lots of staff and children dressed in red or special sports relief clothing.
