



Pupil Premium Funding is allocated to schools based on the number of children from low income families who have been eligible for Free School Meals entitlement (FSM) within the last six years.

For the academic year 2018/19, an allocation of £19,360 has been received by Dundry C of E Primary School. This is to be allocated specifically for strategies which narrow the gap in attainment between pupils who receive the Pupil Premium grant and their peers. The table below shows the distribution of these pupils throughout the school. Funding is distributed at the beginning of each financial year; it is therefore important to consider the summer term from 2018, when reflecting on Pupil Premium Spending.
