Now this is our last week of home learning, this time next week we will all be in school together again, yay!

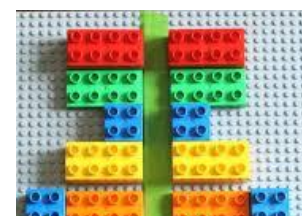
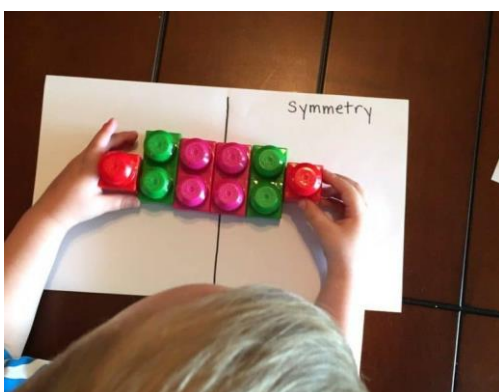
Let's start our day with some phonics as usual, have a look on the school website for today's sound and video. Our sound today is a trigraph, can you guess what this means? It is one sound made up by 3 letters. Today's sound is **igh**, make sure you don't say i g h as it is one sound which is igh. To remind ourselves we can say fly **high**, what other igh words can you think of? Can you have a go at writing down 5 words using the igh sound? Like high, sign, light, right and night. Our red word today is the word **you**. Can you think of a sentence to say using the word you?

Some maths now and today we are going to think about symmetry. Have a look at these pictures what do you notice about them?



They are all symmetrical, that means it is the same on both sides. Can you find anything in your house that is symmetrical? Maybe a pattern on your door or window? Maybe a plate or a bowl? Have a look at your own face in the mirror and see if you think your face is symmetrical. Have a go at

making your own symmetrical creations like the ones below.



Let's do some exercise now, can you pick 3 of your favourite GoNoodle songs to dance to on Youtube.

Maybe you could spend some time outside and go on a spring walk, what signs of spring can you spot? Can you see any daffodils growing?
