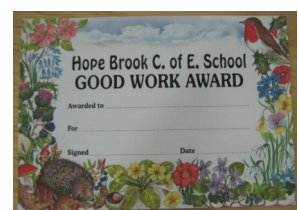

If your child receives 5 Good Work Awards, please ask them to bring them to the school office, so that they receive the Head Teachers Award and get to keep the cup for a week!



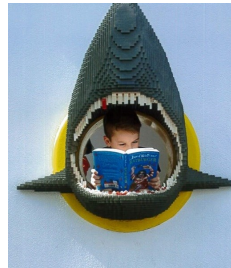
## Orienteering

Every year, a School Development Plan is created to focus on specific areas within the school. We reviewed it at our last meeting. At the start of the year, specific actions are defined and these are executed throughout the year. The impact of these actions is continually monitored during the year and assessed at the end, when a new plan is drawn up for the following year. In this way, the Head, Leaders, Staff and Governors of the school maintain a process of continual improvement throughout the year and from one year to the next. The current plan focused on ensuring progress of specific groups of pupils, development of the "big ideas" curriculum and "using talk". Good progress has been made. We are seeing some benefits of the interventions now and anticipate seeing more at the start of the new school year.

## Review of Focus Areas for 2017/18

At the beginning of each academic year we set out our focus areas and we felt it would be of interest to update you on each of the areas and the progress made this year.

- ◇ Holiday childcare—Pippins has provided holiday childcare for two days each week during the Easter and Half Term holidays and will provide the same for four weeks of the Summer Holidays.
- ◇ Spelling—Our spelling bee and Bananagram competitions have encouraged the children to enjoy spelling
- ◇ Drawing, mapping and handwriting—We have been exploring different ways of recording learning, by using diagrams and labelled drawings, particularly in our topic work.
- ◇ Maths—Rock Stars Times Tables is an online game for helping to learn times tables, it has been particularly popular with the children.
- ◇ Pupil voice—For the summer term we have been using an assembly slot to find out how the children feel about a number of areas—trips, the topics we cover, collective worship, playground games, clubs and the sports we offer and we'll be feeding this back into our everyday practice.

## Mobile Phones

In the current climate and with particular reference to safeguarding issues, we would ask that no primary school age child should have a phone in school with them during the day. If there are extenuating circumstances that mean your child requires a phone either before or after school, please let the school know so that we can arrange for the safe storage of the phone in the school office during school hours.



## Swimming Lessons



With the current Government emphasis on making sure that children can swim 25m when they leave primary school, we will be providing additional opportunities for some children to practise their skills over the next academic year.

Swimming lessons will start on Monday 10th September for all children in Years 3 & 4.
