The school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and Devon and Cornwall Police

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

FOCUS OF THE WEEK: Friendship & Tolerance. Divali Festival

Kynance -

Next week we will be exploring more Autumn. We will be finding out about animals and what some of them do in Autumn to prepare for Winter. We will be continuing with our phonics - see the classroom window. In maths we will be introducing children to addition and subtraction. Children start the week by practising subitising numbers up to 6 using fingers and dots on a dice. They move on to find number pairs to 5 and then to 6, and are shown the addition number sentence that goes with each pair. They are introduced to simple subtractions using their number pairs, and learn to recognise that adding and subtracting are inverse operations. Next week we will be sending home a reading book. We will also be sending home a book in which children will be practicing writing their name. Please make sure you have your book bag in school on Thursday to take it all home.

Gwithian -

Next week Gwithian will be inventing our own story based on 'The Enormous Turnip'. They will be following the structure of the original story and changing aspects, such as characters and vegetables, to make the story their own. In Maths we are revisiting 2D shapes and identifying them in real-life contexts. In Science we are going to continue to use Scientific vocabulary, such as 'carnivore, herbivore and omnivore', and will be applying this to our writing. In Topic we will be evaluating products. Gwithian have produced some fantastic homework over the past few weeks and we are so proud of their efforts - resulting in us having to mark them twice a week! Superb.

Sennen -

In Sennen Class we are continuing with our fiction book 'The Owl who Was Afraid of The Dark' and we will be innovating it as a class to 'The Mouse who was afraid of cheese'. In Maths we are having a subtraction week, thinking about using our number bonds to subtract and then moving on to using written methods to help us. In Science next week we are going to be thinking about our organs, in particular, our heart and why it is important. In Topic we are going to be thinking about the life cycle of a bird.

Fistral -

Next week we will be covering grammar linked to the year 3 expectations. In maths we will be focussing on mastery problem solving activities linked to our math skills learnt this half term. In topic we will be identifying human and physical geographical features. In science we will be investigating this enquiry question; Do people who exercise a lot get their breath back more quickly after strenuous exercise?

Pentire -

Pentire class will be inventing their own story based on the theme in our class story 'Journey to Jo'burg'. We will be creating a story map and we will be using our class success criteria to write independently. In Numeracy we will be completing a week on methods of multiplication and division and applying this in working out one step and two step word problems. In science we will be looking at food webs and food chains amongst different animals and we will be finding out how they are different amongst animal groups. In Topic work the class will be finding out more about the geography of the countries in the continent of Africa.

Watergate -

We will be completing our detective stories and writing and creating some of our own mysteries to solve.

Marazion -

In English next week, Marazion will invent their own Greek myth. They have been writing super innovations where the minotaur was changed to a cerberus and the labyrinth became an amphitheatre. Applying their knowledge of myths, the children will include all of the features and include their own ghastly beast! In maths, Marazion will continue to solve division problems by using short and long division. The children will apply their understanding of division to divide 4 by 2 digit numbers and find missing numbers.
