



## William Penn Timetable, Logistics, Health and Safety and Safeguarding – 13.11.2020

Dear Parents

Thank you once again for the consideration and support that we continue to see from the parent body. The pupils remain a credit to you too. We continue to make adjustments to how we safely organise life at school, as we continually seek to improve and in response to the national and local COVID 19 contexts.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, we will be reverting to our usual pick up time of 3.15pm for all pupils as of 16<sup>th</sup> November 2020. This reflects your good practice in picking up your children promptly and efficiently, and should limit the time that some children will spend on the playground as the weather deteriorates.

**In order for this to remain effective, we are asking parents to come in to the playground and walk along the length of the hedge before turning and walking out through the car park gate. It is important that we maintain social distancing and do not 'bunch' at the school gate. We are also asking that adults wear a mask when on the school run.**

**We are also reminding pupils and parents that only essential items and bags, required for the school day, may be brought in to school. With this in mind, and in line with some other local schools, we will no longer be able to store pupil's bags etc in the school office. Whilst we recognise that this may cause some inconvenience, we hope that you will understand that safety and the integrity of our 'bubbles' must take priority.**

**All communication regarding pupils must come to the school office by email and not in person. Please do not put any documents etc in the children's school bags. Please use the crate on the playground. If you are communicating directly with staff by email, please remember to copy in the school office.**

As previously, I would like to share with you, the information below, which will remind you some detail as to our current arrangements. The main factors that have been considered are:

- Health and Safety considerations
- Wellbeing of pupils and staff
- Increasing and maintaining indoor and outdoor provision for the pupils during the autumn and winter
- The sustainability of school provision and ability to stay open in the event of staffing shortages

It is important to emphasise that the information below is not exhaustive but summarises many of the points that will be of interest to you. As you might imagine, the details are also subject to change depending on external guidance and staff availability, as well as the health of the pupils and staff within the groups, and indeed at home.

We are pleased to welcome Ms Lipscombe back to school today as you will see from the timetable below.

I hope that the information is useful to you and if you require further information, please contact the school via the school office and we will do our very best to get back to you as quickly as possible.

### Access to School Site and School Office

- We ask that children are brought to school by one adult.
- Parents are asked to queue 2 metres apart before entering the school via the pedestrian gate and following the directional loop around the playground.
- No parents are allowed on site further than the double gates between the playground and the carpark.
- Parents and pupils will enter via the pedestrian gate and leave via the main double gates.
- Whilst we appreciate that parents may wish to self-distance and 'catch up', we ask that they leave the area promptly to allow for the safe arrival of subsequent families.
- School office access will be via email or telephone but there will be no entrance to school building for any reason.
- Access to and from classrooms will be via external doors only (except in an emergency).
- Please keep closely to the pickup and drop off times outlined above.

### School Attendance

- School attendance is mandatory and the usual rules on attendance will apply.

### Safeguarding

- Parents are asked to update any safeguarding information and inform of any developments that may not be known to the school.

## **Health and Safety**

- Handwashing routines for children will continue to be published and established with pupils – 6 times a day – as they arrive, before and after break – before and after lunch and before they leave plus whenever they go to the toilet or undertake outside learning.
- Bubble 1 and Bubble 2 have their own facilities for handwashing
- Children are reminded to cough/sneeze into elbow and not to touch faces.
- Classrooms remain organised with separate desks giving as much space as possible between seats and facing forward, where possible.
- Fire and Lock Down Drills will take place as soon as possible and before half term, each term.
- Emergency access will be maintained through the hall
- Parents are asked to update any healthcare plans and confirm that the school is fully informed of any changes in medical needs and requirements.
- Face coverings do not need to be worn in school.
- If pupils arrive wearing disposable face coverings they should wash hands, dispose of covering in the covered bin and rewash hands.
- If pupils arrive wearing reusable face coverings they should wash hands, place the covering in their own sealable plastic bag, then in their school bag, and rewash hands.

## **‘Bubbles’**

- We have 2 ‘bubbles’
  - Bubble 1: Year R/1/2
  - Bubble 2: Years 3/4/5/6
- Whilst, the aim will be to keep bubbles separate, the government has said that some mixing may be necessary, such as for specialist teaching. We will try to keep this to the minimum.
- Older children will be encouraged to keep their distance within groups.
- It is permitted for staff to work across different groups in order to deliver the school timetable, but they will keep their distance from pupils and other staff as much as they can (ideally 2 metres apart).

## **Break and Lunchtimes**

- Time spent outside will be in separate and specifically demarcated spaces for each bubble, as shown in the timetable above.
- Break time equipment will be separate too; YR/1/2 – trim trail and KS1 outdoor area plus part of the playground, Y3/4 and Y5/6 part of the playground or the field if dry enough
- Children will be supervised by the adults in their group.
- Each group also has a first aider.
- Hot lunches are available. Lunchtime will be staggered to allow table cleaning between uses by children from different bubbles. Children in Fry and JBB need to order via the Chartwells portal.
- Lunch boxes or plastic bags should be used by pupils to bring food to school (plastic bags will not be returned home). Children will need to be able to open and eat all food without adult help.

## **Equipment and Resources can be shared within Groups**

- Classroom-based resources like books and games can be used and shared within a group. They will be cleaned regularly, as will frequently touched surfaces.

- However, children are not able to share individual and very frequently used equipment like pencils and pens.
- Any resources shared between groups, such as sports, art and science equipment, will be either:
  - Cleaned frequently and meticulously, and always between groups using them; or
  - Rotated so they can be unused and out of reach for a period of 48 hours (72 hours for plastics) between use by different groups
  - Children will keep their stationery in pencil cases with their own pencil, pencil sharpener, ruler, rubber, glue stick, coloured pencils, pen (Y6). **We request that these are clearly labelled and supplied from home, to stay in school.**
  - Children will be asked to wash their hands after returning books to the library or book boxes and after selection.
  - Home/School books not to be used until further notice.

## **Measures for Responding to Infections**

### **If someone has symptoms**

- The child or member of staff is required to self-isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms or until they are in receipt of a negative test outcome.
- Family members are required to self-isolate for 14 days or until the negative test outcome has been received.
- Parents are asked to inform the school immediately of the results of a test.

### **If there's a Confirmed Case of Coronavirus**

- If the school becomes aware that someone has tested positive, we will contact our local health protection team. This team will also contact the school if they become aware that someone at your school has tested positive.
- The team will carry out a rapid risk assessment to confirm who's been in close contact with the person when they were infectious, and make sure they are asked to self-isolate.
- Close contact means:
  - Direct close contact - face-to-face contact with an infected person for any length of time, within 1 metre, including:
    - Being coughed on
    - A face-to-face conversation, or
    - Unprotected physical contact (skin-to-skin)
    - Proximity contacts - extended close contact (within 1 to 2 metres for more than 15 minutes) with an infected person
    - Travelling in a small car with an infected person
- To help the local health protection team, the school will keep a record of pupils and staff in each group, and any close contact that takes place between children and staff
- The school is not permitted to share the names or details of people with coronavirus unless it's essential for protecting others.

### **If there's a possible outbreak**

- If there's 2 or more cases within 14 days, the school will work with our local health protection to decide if additional action is needed.
- In some cases, the team may recommend that a larger number of other pupils self-isolate as a precautionary measure, such as the whole year bubble.
- Whole-school closure will not generally be necessary, and the school has been advised **not to** consider this except if the local health protection team advises it.
- If an outbreak is confirmed, a mobile testing unit may be dispatched to the school.

### **Some Trips Can Start Again**

- The school will not be running any school trips during this term. There will be no events/gatherings of parents at the school this term.

### **The Friends (Before and After School) Club**

- The children attending The Friends Club will operate as a bubble/bubbles with small consistent groups, before and after school.

### **After School Clubs**

- As Mr Petros will be returning to school in his capacity as sports coach, he will also be able to run his after school club.
- Mrs Constable will also be resuming her Maths Club.
- No other clubs will be operating at this stage other than Friends Club, in order to manage risks.

### **Return to Usual School Uniform**

- Normal school uniform requirements will operate in the Autumn Term, with the exception that pupils are asked to wear their PE kits on days when they have PE or are attending the after school sports club. Pupils will not need school uniform in school on these days.
- Uniforms won't need to be cleaned any more than usual, or with methods different from normal.

### **No routine Ofsted inspections in the Autumn Term**

- William Penn is not due an Ofsted Inspection and Ofsted has suspended routine inspections for the time being.
- However:
  - Inspectors will visit a sample of schools to discuss how they're managing the return of all their pupils, but these visits won't result in judgements. The insights that inspectors gather will be statioaggregated nationally to share learning with the education sector and beyond
  - Ofsted can still inspect a school in response to any significant concerns, such as safeguarding
  - The government intends for routine inspections to restart from January 2021, though the exact timing is under review.
