Follow Government guidelines	Follow these guidelines: If anyone in the school becomes unwell with any symptoms, including new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they must be sent home and advised to follow ' stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection ', which sets out that they must self-isolate and should arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19). If positive, self-isolate for 10 days. Other members of their household (including any siblings) should self-isolate for 10 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms. If child/ adult tests positive, those who have been in close proximity with a person will need to self-isolate for 10 days. Heads to contact LA Covid hotline to	All	Ongoing

Staff to wear PPE and child awaiting collection, should be moved, if possible, to a room, where they can be isolated behind a closed door, or outside if weather permits, depending on the age and needs of the child, with appropriate adult supervision. A window should be opened for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from other people. Child to leave school building using the outdoor route where possible.</p> <p>If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, they should use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom must be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else. Any members of staff who have helped someone with symptoms and any pupils who have been in close contact with them do not need to go home to self-isolate unless they develop symptoms themselves (in which case, they should arrange a test) or if the symptomatic person subsequently tests positive (see below) or they have been requested to do so by NHS Test and Trace. Everyone must wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds with soap and running water or use hand sanitiser after any contact with someone who is unwell. SOMEONE TESTS POSITIVE	All Transmission of the virus		<p>Engage with the NHS Test and Trace process</p> <p>If someone tests positive, they should follow the ‘stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection’ and must continue to self-isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste. This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. The 10-day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 10 days. Provide details of anyone they have been in close contact with if they were to test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or if asked by NHS Test and Trace. Managing a confirmed case			<p>Manage confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community</p> <p>Schools must contact the local health protection team. This team will also contact schools directly if they become aware that someone who has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) attended the school – as identified by NHS Test and Trace.</p> <p>The health protection team will carry out a risk assessment to confirm who has been in close contact with the person during the period that they were infectious, and ensure they are asked to self-isolate.</p> <p>Based on the advice from the health protection team, schools must send home those people who have been in close contact with the person who has tested positive, advising them to self-isolate for 10 days since they were last in close contact with that person when they were infectious. Close contact means:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • direct close contacts - face to face contact with an infected individual for any length of time, within 1 metre, including being coughed on, a face to face conversation, or unprotected physical contact (skin-to-skin) • proximity contacts - extended close contact (within 1 to 2 metres for more than 15 minutes total in the day) with an infected individual • travelling in a small vehicle, like a car, with an infected person <p>The health protection team will provide definitive advice on who must be sent home. To support them in doing so, we keep a record of pupils and staff in each group,</p> <p>A template letter will be sent to parents and staff if needed. Schools must not share the names or details of people with coronavirus.</p> <p>Household members of those contacts who are sent home do not need to self-isolate themselves unless the child, or staff member who is self-isolating subsequently develops symptoms.
