What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding to cater for substantial school sport investment. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

How will we be spending the Sports Funding and who will benefit?

The school agrees that the money must be used so that:

- All children access a high level of sports coaching
- Staff improve their knowledge and understanding of delivering PE sessions and enhance sustainability of high level teaching of PE
- More able children extend their learning and improve performance levels
- Children of mixed abilities experience competitive competition via internal and external school competitions
- Engage a high number of pupils in lunchtime and after-schools
- Provide more sporting opportunities to children with special educational needs and vulnerable groups

Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE

The school have hired an experienced sports coach to act as Head of PE. The premium is used to release the head of PE 1 day per week to help oversee the running of the PE department. This helps organize and run enriching activities throughout the school such as the numerous sports clubs, prepare for a large number of competitions and observe the effectiveness of PE lessons across the school.

In addition, the school has hired the services of Suffolk Norse swimming teachers to provide swimming

lessons for Years 5. Lessons will be taught by Suffolk Norse staff alongside teachers. 96% of our current Year 6 children can swim a distance of 25 meters.

Increasing school clubs and participation

(2016-17 Ks2 attendance to school run sports clubs was in excess of 200%)

The school is proud to a range of extra-curricular activities, accessed by children from Key Stages one and two. We are also please to boast an increase of participation from children from our Specialist Support Centre. These clubs will continue to run with no fee charged for sports clubs run by school staff who run them but if an outside provider is used then a small fee may be charged.

A range of after school sports clubs are available depending on the season. Clubs include football, netball, tag rugby, cricket and gymnastics, cross country, futsal and multi sports.

Providing opportunities for children to compete

(2016-17 we attended completed 15 NGB level 1 competitions and 14 level 2 competitions)

Dale Hall Primary are proud members of **IPSSA** (Ipswich Primary School Sports Association) and the **Suffolk School Games**. Our membership allows us to compete in a range of sports and activities across the school year. We also have links with neighboring schools which has helped us to develop our teams in readiness for competitive participation.

Professional Development

(Last year staff attended dance, gymnastics and tennis CPD run by Suffolk School Games)

Through being members of Suffolk School Games we are able to access a wide range of termly CPD (curriculum professional development) opportunities. In addition to this the school have made links with outside agencies such as EBAT (Elena Baltacha Trust) Premiere Sport and Learn Play Grow. Each agency offers after school sports activities and offer taster sessions to allow children to experience what these clubs are like.
