Conflict: Then and Now

Please choose **4** projects to complete by **Friday 30th of November**. You can pick any 4 projects. Bring them in once completed and they can then be part of our topic gallery in the classroom. We will have a project showcase on **Wednesday 5th December** to celebrate what you have created. I am excited to see what you come up with!

<p>Time-travelling journal</p> <p>Imagine that you have travelled back in time and have landed in WW1. You have been thrown back a century. Write a journal entry about what you can see/hear/smell and feel.</p> 	<p>Research</p> <p>Research your own family history and find out where some of your family members were between 1914 and 1918. Create a mini family tree to show us what you have learnt.</p>	<p>Fact-file</p> <p>Create a fact-file about Syrian refugees fleeing to European countries in the last 3 years. Make sure you pick really interesting facts and include pictures too to match your facts.</p>
<p>Photo collage</p> <p>Make a collage of photos showing a journey from WW1 to the current Syrian conflict. Include captions on some of the photos to give us some background.</p>	<p>Surprise me!</p> <p>Create your own project based on our topic 'Conflict: Then and Now'. Be creative!</p> 	<p>Poetry</p> <p>Use your knowledge of Syrian refugees and research some new information and write a piece of rhyming poetry based on the life of a refugee.</p>
<p>Interpretative artwork</p> <p>Design and create a piece of artwork around the theme of Conflict. You can be as abstract as you like. Explore different ways of being creative e.g. making a collage, using oil pastels or maybe even using papier-mâché.</p>	<p>Emergency supply pack</p> <p>Plan and design an emergency supply pack for refugee families to be given to them upon entering the United Kingdom. Consider medical supplies and long-lasting food.</p>	<p>Retro recipes</p> <p>Research some recipes of types of food they would have made and eaten during WW1 and try to make them yourselves.</p> 

Weekly homework:
