

ART

KS1



- Children begin to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.
- They use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.
- They develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.
- Children learn about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, exploring their differences and similarities.

KS2

- As children progress throughout primary school, they begin to:
 - create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.
 - improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]
- Learn about great artists, architects and designers in history.

KS1 & KS2

Throughout primary school, children learn how to:

Design

Children design and develop ideas through discussion. Then, they begin to use research to generate functional and appealing products.

Make

Children begin to increasingly select from and use a wider range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks accurately [for example, cutting, shaping, joining and finishing].

Evaluate

Children explore and evaluate their work and others to make improvements.
