ARB

Beacon Area Resource Base is a specialist class for 10 Key Stage 2 aged children with special educational needs or disability attached to the main stream Beacon Ace Academy.



ADMISSION TO BEACON ARB

The admissions process for an Area Resource Base (ARB) is via an Education health and care (EHC) statutory assessment or through the information and evidence gathered at an annual review meeting.

The decision about allocation of these places is the responsibility of the Cornwall Council Statutory Special Educational Needs Panel.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM AN ARB CLASS.

Beacon ARB class has 10 mixed age, mixed ability pupils. The ARB has a higher ratio of adults to support the pupils and this is allocated according to need. At Beacon we have one class teacher and 4 teaching assistants. Lessons and learning are planned to meet the needs of the children.



CURRICULUM

Through a wide variety of experiences we aim to nurture a love of learning.

In our small specialist class there are opportunities to work on personal, social and emotional development and to build speech and language ability.

We focus daily on reading, writing and mathematics. Each term we explore a topic which brings in learning from other subjects.
