He was born in 1451, in Italy.

Christopher Columbus' life

Christopher Columbus learned to sail in a wooden ship with sails.

His dream was to go to China.

The king and queen of Spain gave him money to buy ships.

His famous adventures

He set sail from Europe on 3rd August, 1492, with his sailors.

They did not know where they would land.

He discovered new lands, they called it 'The New World'.

They arrived in America in 1492, but Christopher Columbus did not discover America, the Vikings did.

He started regular contact with America and brought over new foods.

He had to leave his damaged ship there with 40 men on board.

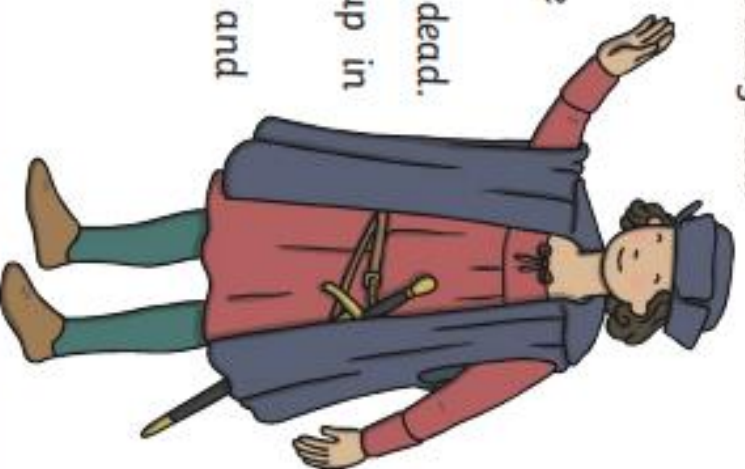
When he came back for them, they were dead.

He sailed again in 1502 and ended up in Central America.

He was very ill when he got home and died in 1506.

- His first trip at sea was when he was 13 years old.

- The sailors had to sleep on the deck of the ships.

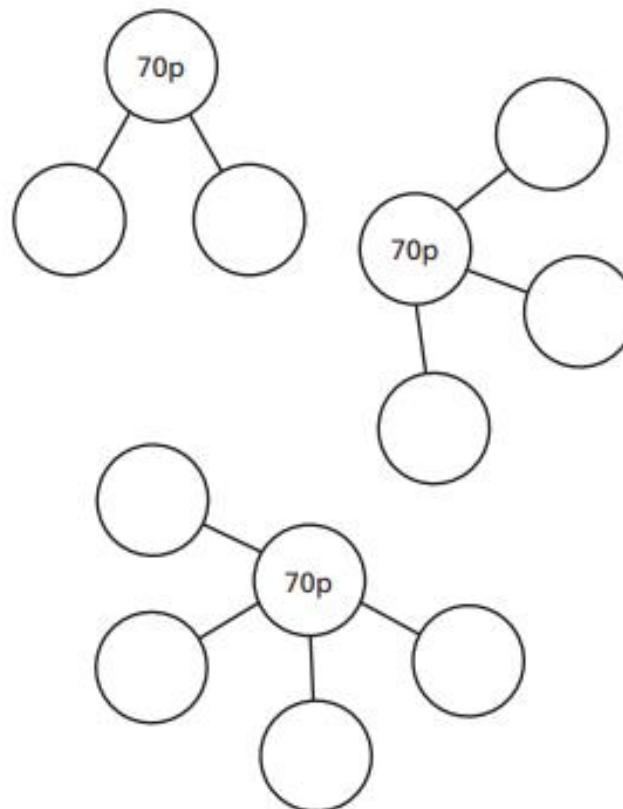

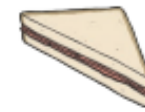

The first voyage



It took a long time to prepare for the voyage. Christopher Columbus set sail in August 1492 when he was 41 years old. He took three ships called the *Niña*, *Pinta* and *Santa Maria*. They sailed west across the Atlantic Ocean. The journey took more than two months.

Christopher Columbus thought he had arrived in the Indies but he was really in the Americas. He took back some things that no one in Europe had seen before, such as pineapples and tobacco.

Impact



Christopher Columbus' voyages had a huge impact on the rest of the world. He found a way from Europe to the Americas, which became known as the New World. He was called 'The Discoverer of the New World' even though the Vikings and the Taino had been there before him.

He started a time of exploration that lasted for centuries. Many Europeans went to live in the Americas. Many of the people living in Central and South America today would not live there without Christopher Columbus making that first voyage.
