The Prefix un-

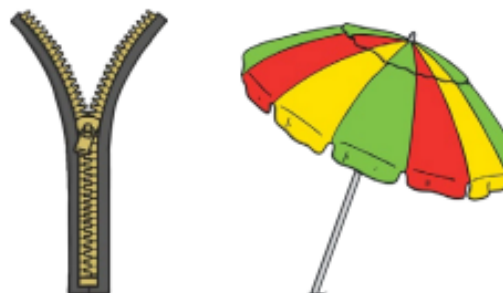
A prefix is a letter or group of letters added to the beginning of a word to make a new word.

When **un-** is added to describing words (**adjectives**), it means 'not'.



kind - **un**kind (not kind)
happy - **un**happy (not happy)

When **un-** is added to action words (**verbs**), it means the reverse of that action.



zip - **un**zip (undo the zip)
cover - **un**cover (remove a cover)

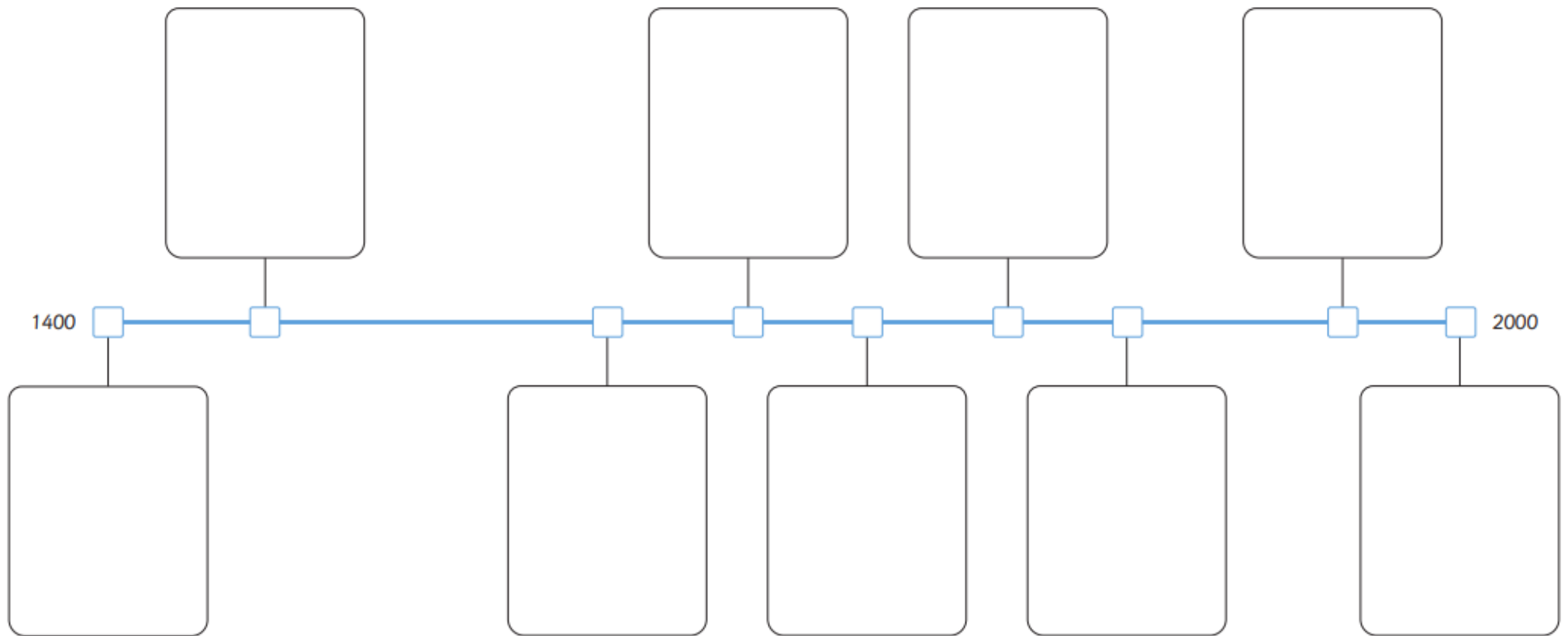

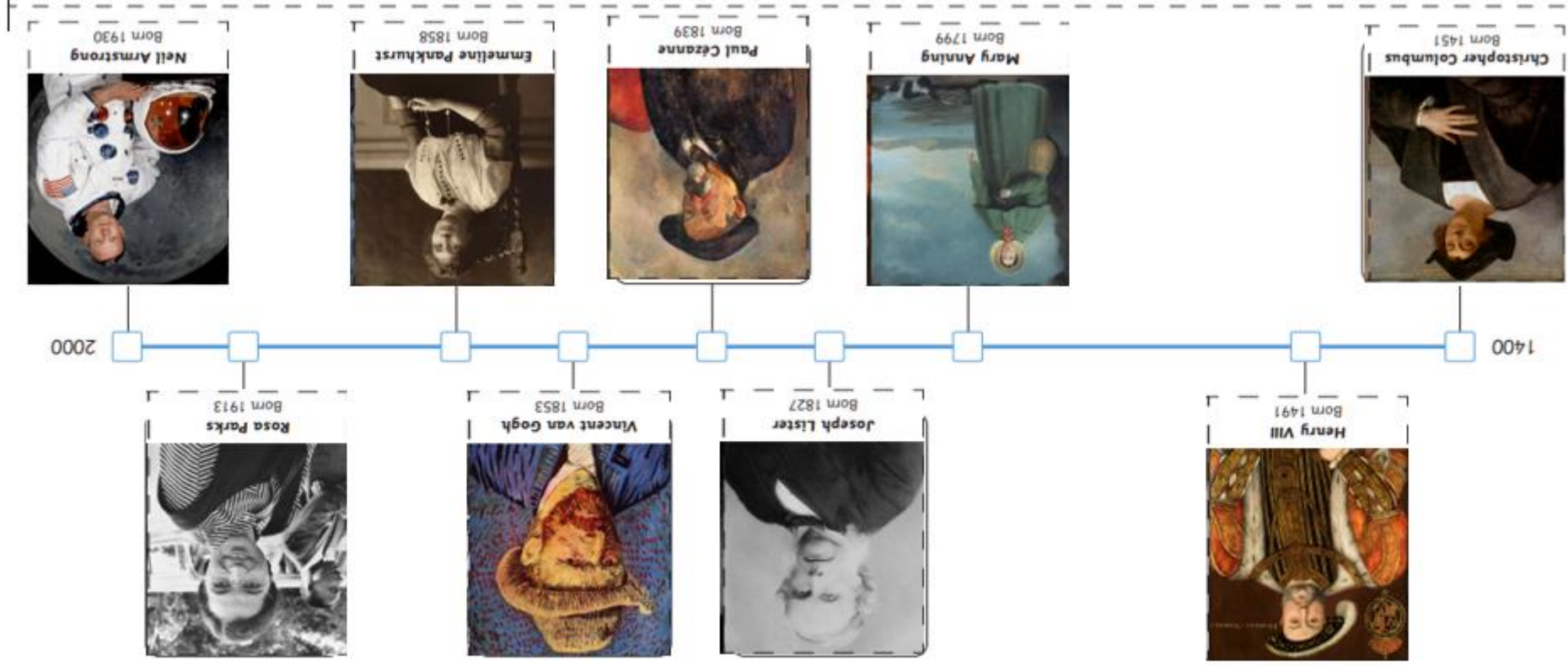
