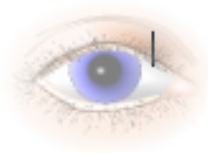

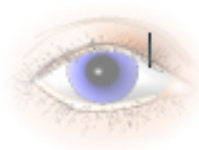

Did You Know...?

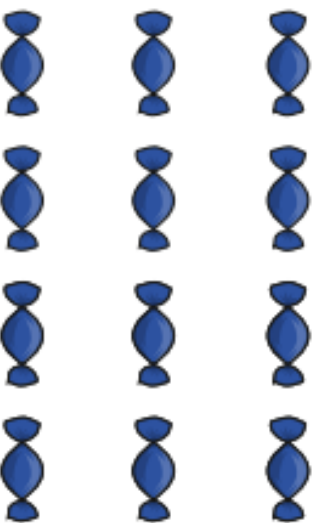
Anyone can use the Internet to post pictures, videos or comments.

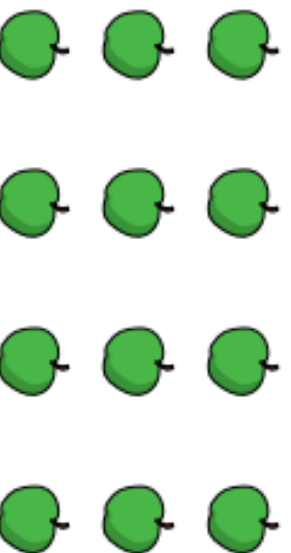

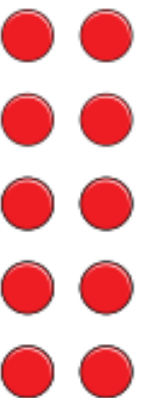
