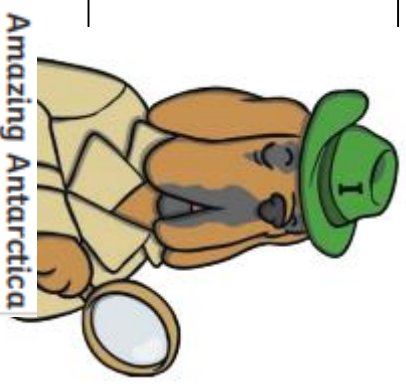
Antarctic Explorers- The Five Oceans
