AN OLD COTTON
SHIRT IS
IDEAL

BURNED

A RIBBON, OR
KNITTED GARTER,
NOT TOO TIGHT!
MAY BE WORN
BELOW KNEE

LONG SOCKS
WITH
TROUSERS
TUCKED IN!

"DESERT BOOT" LIKE UP
SHOES ARE IDEAL

THE IDEAL HAT IS A PLAIN
FELT HAT, BUT A WOOL
KNITTED HAT WILL DO.
(NO BRIGHT COLOURS).

FOR WARMTH, AND AS
PROTECTIVE CLOTHING, A
PIECE OF ROUGH CLOTH
E.G. AN OLD BLANKET,
WITH HOLE CUT FOR THE
HEAD, (WORN AS A
TABARD), WITH STRING
TO SECURE WAIST,
(AS A BELT). (THIGH
LENGTH)

OLD TROUSERS (THEY WILL GET MUDDY)!
WHICH MAY BE EITHER CUT OFF
BELOW THE KNEE, OR TUCKED INTO
LONG SOCKS, WHICH COVER THEM
TO JUST BELOW THE KNEE.

ROUGH CLOTH LEGGINGS MAY BE WORN OVER
SOCKS. THESE MAY BE WORN PULLED
UP (OVER THIGHS) OR TURNED DOWN OVER
A GARTER. THE BOTTOM OF THE
LEGGING IS MADE LIKE SKI PANTS AND GAVE
THEM THE NAME "STIRRUP HOSE"

SHOES MUST BE STOUT, WATERPROOF,
WARM FOOTWEAR. WELLIES WILL DO
IF NOTHING ELSE IS AVAILABLE
(WITH LEGGINGS TURNED
DOWN)

FELT HAT MAY BE WORN

NOTES ON COSTUME

COLOURS SHOULD BE VERY
SUBDUED, NO ELECTRIC BLUES,
REDS OR FLOURESCENTS.
FOR WARMTH WOOLIES MAY
BE WORN UNDERNEATH

FOOTWEAR MUST BE
STRONG AND WATERPROOF

THE WOOLY CLOTH FOR
MALE TABARDS, (WHICH
GIRLS MAY WEAR ALSO),
MAY BE OLD BLANKETS
FROM JUMBLE SALES.

SHAWLS ARE SQUARES
FOLDED DIAGONALLY

EVERYTHING SHOULD BE
DURABLE AND "NO FRILLS"
SUBDUED COLOUR AND
MOST IMPORTANT
DRY FEET!

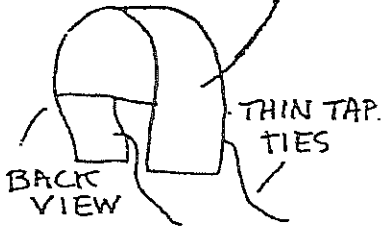
CHILDREN WILL BE WORKING
