



PRIMARY SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING 2016/17

Currently the Government provides national funding in the region of £150 million per annum to improve the quality and provision of physical education and school sport in primary schools. Each school will receive £8,000 plus £5 per Key Stage aged pupil each year. This means that in the academic year 2016/17 Wraysbury Primary School will receive a PE Grant of £9,565.00. Schools have the freedom to choose how they spend this money. Here at Wraysbury Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. Detailed below is the proposed spending for the PE grant in the academic year 2016/17 and the intended impact upon our pupils.
