While everyone appreciated how busy staff are, I believe you would save time answering emails / phone queries, if parents were properly informed. It would also improve parent/school relationships. It doesn't need to be huge things, maybe new topic could go in the newsletter so parents can discuss with their children? Parents to be given more than 24 hrs notice on things such as parents consultations. Info on what younger children are working on in class could be jotted in yellow books - such as what times tables they are working on. It would help parents support their children in school.	The obvious answer is not to let Mr Ellis leave !! It's an outstanding school and preschool we are very happy with our children attending. Our daughter is very excited to start in September. The only thing I feel would be helpful if each class had an email address we could ask any questions or keep in contact with teachers regarding their children's progress, I feel it would be easier than a phone call. The school is managing the safety guidelines regarding covid very well but it can be a little difficult to informally catch up.
