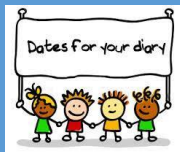

## What have your children been learning?

This week Class 1 have had fun learning about insects, writing about the bad-tempered ladybird and finding lines of symmetry on bugs and butterflies. They enjoyed a visit from an ex pupil Kaylie Haines who is a veterinary nurse at Penbode Vets.

This week in English, Class 2 have all written up their Formula One Race reports neatly, and begun independent research of the history of Formula One. For Maths, Year 3 have been using the formal written method for division, and Year 2 have been solving fraction problems.

This week, class 3 have been thinking about how they can use their experience of different books, to help engage their audience, when writing their own stories. They are going to use the stories they have written, in a book of silly short tales, for others to read and enjoy in school. In science, we have been considering the purpose and names of all the muscles in the human body, and how they help the body to move, and the impact on the functions of our body. In Maths, we have been looking at symmetry and co-ordinates, with the children having to draw their own grids, and complete some complicated shapes. In ICT, we have continued our work with the Lego models. In Art, we have continued our focus on sketching in detail, looking at the key features of birds of prey.



Thank you from the Garden Club, for all the donations to the wildlife garden, including Dan Shute for building supplies, Bodmin Herb Nursery for plants, and Brooks for pond plants. Also, a big thank you to Louise Gunning and Katie Bowman-Harris who helped get the posts in. Next term, they will be making more habitats and adding to the planting.

She has put so much time and effort into supporting the children, and to getting our front playground looking like it does.
