## Walk to School Week

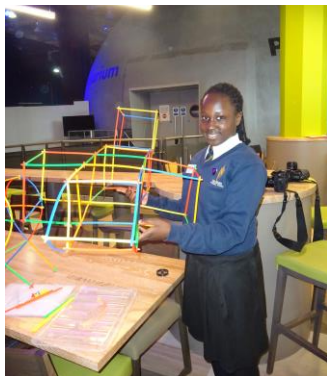
