This week in MATHS: Division ÷

I have 12 coins. How many different ways can you share them in to EQUAL groups?

Now try this with 20 and 24 coins. Can an adult help you write this as a division number sentence?

Eg $12 \div 6 = 2$

If I share 15 toys between 4 people, each person will have an equal amount.

True / False?

Draw a picture to show your working out and explain to an adult what you have done using mathematical

This week in Phonics/Spelling:

Learn all your CEW (common exception words) for your year group (you'll find them in your Home School Diary or online). Suggestions on how to do it...

- Play 'Hangman'
- Play schools and test your pupils
- Write them as rainbow or pyramid words

This week in ENGLISH:

Listen to Commotion in the Ocean by Giles Andreae on YouTube (or read it if you have the book).

What do you notice? Which poem did you enjoy most?

Some of the poems were rhyming, some were funny and some were acrostic poems. Try writing some poems about your sand sculpture and other creatures in the sea.

Experiment with different styles of poem.

Post your favourite on Tapestry.

Art/Design Technology:

Now you've written about your sand creature, create an interesting and colourful picture of it using a variety of media eg paint, felt tips, collage, wax crayons



READING

Have you any poetry books?

Or can you find some poems online?

Read one aloud. Remember to use expression to engage the listener.

When you have practiced a few times, ask an adult to record you and then post the video on Tapestry.



Physical activity:

Incorporate as many skills you have been learning this term in a relay where each leg of the relay requires a different skill eg you could bounce a ball for one leg, balance a book on your head for the 2nd leg, run backwards for the 3rd leg and jump like a frog for the last leg.

TAVISTOCK

Have you ever walked on the tow path along the canal through Tavistock? If not, ask your adults if you can take a walk one day.

The canal starts at Abbey Weir and on its way to Morwellham Quay passes over an aqueduct and goes through a tunnel.

What can you see along the section you walk and what was the canal used for?

Maybe you could stop and draw something you see or make a list of the things you see. If you can, go a second time - do you see the same things or have some things changed?
