

# West Green Primary School Pupil Premium Spending Plan 2018 /19

## Staffing:

Our classroom based LSA's have a key role in supporting all our children and particularly those entitled to pupil premium funding. This includes their involvement in developing and supporting children's individual action plans and tracking progress. **Teaching assistants are deployed wisely to help disadvantaged pupils. Ofsted October 2018**

Extra support for pupil premium children is provided by our Deputy Head Teacher and SENCO by working with groups or individuals.

## Action plan and classroom resources:

Children's needs are identified and interventions are planned. We create pupil progress action plan detailing activities and who will be supporting the children. This is reviewed on a regular basis to ensure progress is made.

Reading books are purchased for pupil premium children to take home.

## New for 2018/19 Dedicated Pupil Premium Learning Support Assistant

Our pupil premium LSA has extensive experience working with children. She works with the class teacher and the Leadership team of the school to identify children and devise tailored interventions to support their learning and progress. Interventions range from basic maths skills, reading comprehension and social skills. Lunchtime clubs are run to provide opportunities for extra learning and support.

## Financial support for school trips and school uniform

This enables full participation in school trips including residential trips - which add value to their learning in building confidence and enriches learning beyond the classroom.

## After School Clubs

We provide the opportunity for children entitled to pupil premium to attend after school clubs. In the Autumn Term children entitled to Pupil Premium are given priority to these clubs. This gives our children the chance to try out different range of activities this builds their self esteem and broadens their experiences.

## External Agencies

We buy in support, when required, from outside agencies including 'Your Space' who provide one to one therapy support to aid with readiness to learn and emotional wellbeing, support and guidance for families and teachers. These services work alongside our SENCO and Inclusion Manager to ensure appropriate support is in place.
