

Home Learning Challenges

Spring 2

Mathematics



Counting and Formation	Go on a beach visit and make collections of stones, shells, seaweed and drift wood and record how many are in each group with a stick in the sand.
Number bonds	Can you teach an adult at home the 'number bond' song and using different objects e.g. cars to create number bonds?
Addition	Can you use your toys or objects from around the house to complete an addition number sentence? 5 cars + 1 car = 6 cars



Topic

Recycling	Can you sort different materials ready to be recycled? Are there any items that cannot be recycled?
Superpower	Can you become a planet saving super hero and share your super powers with us e.g. by recycling or rebuilding animal habitats.
Responsibility	What are your responsibilities at home? Do you have responsibility for your pets or cleaning your rooms?

Literacy



Story telling	Can you retell our traditional story from last term? Ask an adult to video you and put on Tapestry - We're going on a bear hunt.
Rhyming	Can you sing different nursery rhymes to your family and discuss the words that rhyme?
Reading Den	Can you make a reading den and snuggle down to read a story?

Phonics



Writing Challenge	Can you make a non-fiction poster about recycling to encourage other people to recycle too?
Red Words	Can you write a caption/sentence including a Red we have learnt? E.g. the red hen.
Name writing	Now you are more confident with writing your first name, challenge yourself to write your surname. Remember correct letter formation.

Physical Development



Self-care	Start to be more independent and have a go at drying and dressing yourself.
Throwing and Catching	Using different size balls with a partner see how many times you can throw and catch it without dropping the ball.
Beach Clean	Go for a walk on a beach and take part in a beach clean-up.

Important Note:

To prepare children for the summer term we would really like you to support your child's use of number and real life application; You could find the right amount of money to pay for a treat at a shop; spot numbers out and about in the environment and start to identify one more/one less; you could count out an amount of objects to be shared fairly.

Any ways of practising numbers skills in fun, practical ways will have a positive impact on your child's development and confidence.
