Coaching in school to introduce children to a new sport and develop skills further.	3,500	Children gain expert tuition in additional sports delivered by coaches. The school will also receive CPD training to further embed new sporting skills.
Staff training	600	PE lead to receive PE training, and disseminate this to staff team. This will allow staff to deliver high quality lesson therefore, enabling high outcomes for all children.
Playdale upkeep	8,500	Replacement of the fence around the playdale, therefore ensuring it remains safe for the children to use.
Renovate hall floor to ensure safety surface for PE	15,000	
Purchase of further games and resources to update existing equipment	1,200	In order to make good progression in games skills, children need access to the correct equipment which is in good order.
Due to COVID-19 the children are in 'class bubbles' and are having staggered playtimes, classes are not allowed to share resources across these bubbles.	800	Purchase of good quality playground activities will allow children to extend and apply their developing skills away from formal PE lessons. Thus, achieve higher outcomes.
