Dear Parents/Carers,

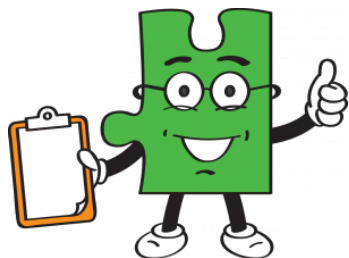
The children have made a fabulous start to the year. I have been hugely impressed with their behaviour and manners.

Earrings

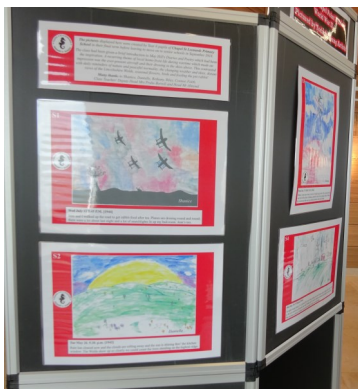
We ask that children only wear studs in their ears. Our policy has changed with regards to PE. Earrings will need to be removed prior to the child being allowed to take part in PE. Teachers are no longer allowed to help children remove or insert earrings, nor are they allowed to allow children to participate in PE with tape over their earrings.



Remember—No child is allowed to participate in PE should they be wearing earrings — even if they have been taped over.
