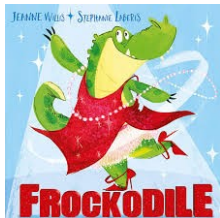

Returning to school in September 2020

The government guidance for our return to school was published yesterday. As I am sure you can imagine there are lots of elements to this. The guidance does state that all children in all year groups should return to school in September unless there is a local lockdown in place. Our priority of course remains the safety of our children, staff and their families and we have started our planning so that everyone knows arrangements for September before the school year ends on 21st July.

Free School Meals

We want to make sure as many eligible pupils as possible are claiming their free school meals, and we want to make it as easy as possible for parents.

Free school meals offer a healthy, wide selection of options for your child at lunch time and can save families approximately £460 per year. If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and already has school meals, check to see if your child will continue to receive free school meals when they are older by applying.



If you are unsure as to whether your child is eligible then you should apply anyway- this way you can ensure that your child is not missing out!
