 22<sup>nd</sup> March – World Water Day – Article 24 – Health

Article 7 - You have the right to a name.  
 Article 14 - You have the right to choose your own religion.  
 Article 15 - You have the right to choose your own friends.  
 Article 16 - You have the right to privacy.  
 Article 24 - You have the right to the best health care possible, safe water to drink, nutritious food, a clean and safe environment, and information to help you stay well.  
 Article 28 - You have the right to a good quality education.  
 Article 31 - You have the right to play and rest.

 Currency- Euro  
 Physical geography- Surrounded by water on three sides. Alps mountains- tallest mountain in Italy Mont Blanc. South of Italy- three active volcanoes.  
 Landmarks- leaning tower of Pisa, Roman Colosseum, Vatican, Venice.  
 Education- compulsory schooling from age 6.

**Key facts about Eastern European Country- Romania**

Continent- Europe  
 Capital- Bucharest  
 Languages- Romanian, Hungarian, German  
 Currency- Romanian leu  
 Physical geography- Carpathian Mountains extend over 600 miles in Romania, in the shape of an arch.  
 Danube River.  
 Landmarks- Bran Castle (Dracula), The Palace of the Parliament.  
 Education- compulsory schooling from age 6.

**Key facts about Non-European Country- India**

Continent- Asia  
 Capital- New Delhi  
 Languages- Hindi, Bengali, many more.  
 Currency- Indian rupee  
 Physical geography- River Ganges, Himalayas, Thar Desert  
 Landmarks- Taj Mahal, Amber Fort  
 Education- compulsory schooling from age 6- only became compulsory in 2009.
