Water Bottles – As you know, the school is committed to improving the health and wellbeing of all our pupils. One of our initiatives is that children only bring plain water in their bottles to drink. The NHS advises that the best drinks to give children are plain water and milk. They go on to say that squash and other drinks such as fruit juices and smoothies can cause tooth decay, and most contain very few nutrients. They can also be filling, which could reduce children's appetite for foods that contain the nutrients they need.



I would ask that all parents and carers only fill children's bottles with water to bring to school.
