Evaluation of 2015/16

What did we want to do?

- Continue to improve staff expertise in delivering PE
- Assessment in PE-how well do our children perform personally based on age related expectations?
- Develop opportunities for the children to participate in competitive sports with schools from a broader area (e.g. Gloucester)
- Top up resources to ensure good quality and message to children on the importance of sport
- Healthy schools week with a focus on healthy eating initiative

Impact of 2015/16 Plan

- Staff have benefited from observing coaches as well as attending training
- A sample of 63 children were assessed (see attached) and the outcomes were that 100% children made progress in one or more activity that was assessed. All children progressed over the course of the year in certain elements of athletic and skill-based development
- The children have competed against larger schools from a wider range of primaries from across the county
- Resources are being built up over time, including additional hockey equipment and athletics (throwing) equipment
- The majority of those who brought lunch boxes were healthy-further work with parents required here.

What are the needs (2016/17)?

- Maintain the good standards and time spent on the delivery of PE to children, including after school clubs, so that children are better prepared to reach their potential
- Increase the breadth to the curriculum so that more able children do more sport, including competitive sports within school and with other schools locally, leading to healthier lifestyles.
- Embed children's learning behaviours and sporting mind-set so that they are highly ambitious and know strategies to help them achieve their goals.

What have we spent Sports Funding on 2016/17

- Expert teaching in PE including cricket, tennis, multi-skills, swimming, dance. Includes extra-curricular activities, often working with teachers to build their skills and confidence £ 8,071.66

- Youth Sport trust £200
- Transport to sporting events £250
- Dursley District SSA £25.00
- Sports badges/awards for representing the school £132.80

All of this will be reviewed and evaluated by *Governors* in the Autumn 2017/18 and added to this on the website

What has been the impact so far?

- Increased participation in PE, especially competitive games/competitions
 - a. Wider variety of after school clubs available for pupils with 'expert' coaches.
 - b. All competitions offered at a local level entered
 - c. G+T offering increased in competitive matches at a broader level i.e. through St Peter's High school where children compete against other Gloucester schools
- Improved CPD opportunities for teachers
 - a. Teacher's included in PE specialist teaching
- Clear improvement in standards based on individual assessments (see assessment report)
- Children aspire to represent the school in local competitions

Areas for development for 2017/18

- Inclusion for disabled pupils/adults-how is this catered for?
- A broader range of PE teaching other than the traditional 'seasonal' sports
- New staff therefore identify areas of expertise and CPD
