

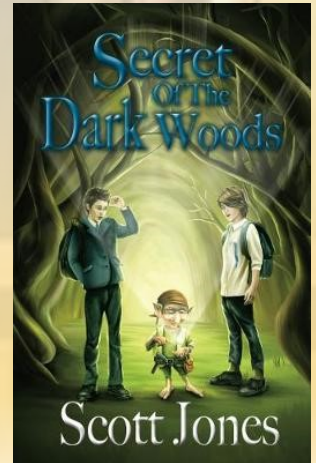

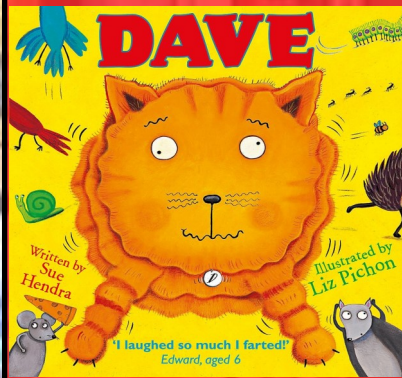

Early Years & Foundation stage recommendation

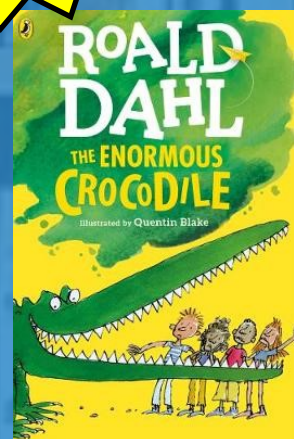

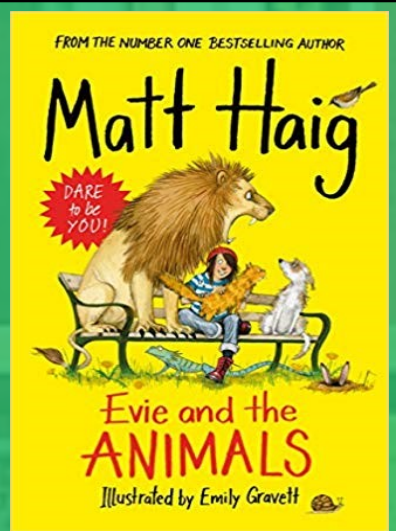
KS1 (Year 1 and 2) recommendation

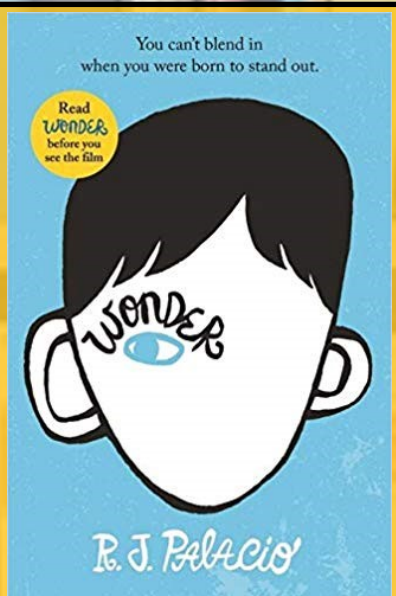
Lower KS2 (Year 3 & 4) recommendation
