

Dear Parents/Carers,

As you will now probably be aware, on June 1st Dundry will be opening its doors to pupils in YR, Y1 and Y6 - as well as children of Key Workers in all year groups. As we will now be back in school Monday-Thursday (we remain open for Key Worker Children on Friday) we are making some changes to home learning. From June 1st we will no longer be sending out home learning each week. That means we are also unable to print any further resources for you to collect. This is to ensure that staff can manage their time effectively and concentrate on providing a safe environment for those children in school.

A timetable comes alongside this letter which summarises the potential structure to the day at home, and slides prepared centrally by the MAT (Multi Academy Trust) will be uploaded on a weekly basis to the Oak Class webpage for children in Year 4 and 5 to complete at home during this time. The daily MAT PowerPoint explains what to do and contains all the lessons for each day. There are also worksheets to complete once you've read the PowerPoint. Any websites needed are linked on the slides so you can just click the button and you're away. Each afternoon there is a different subject for you to learn about, and this will replace Menu Time until further notice. These resources will require internet access. Some lessons can be completed on paper once you have viewed what needs to be done; others are completed via online lesson platforms. Further information about these slides is available on the T6 Timetable below. If there are any problems with regards to accessing these resources, please let me know as soon as possible so that I can give further advice. Alternatively, you can use resources used for home learning from last term.

All learning will be accessed via the Oak Class website. The top part of the webpage will contain important messages, letters/timetables, and learning for the current week. The bottom left part will contain old archived lessons. The bottom right section will provide further/ alternate work to complete should the MAT slides not work, such as the superb Maths booklets for Years 4 and 5.

The timetable for children at home is different to the one used by children based in school. Children in school will complete the morning work in the same order as home learners, but in the afternoons will also complete different subjects and focus on the topic of Ancient Greece. A resource for this will be available on our web page should any home learners want it.

I know you have all been accessing Seesaw over the home learning period. I have had the feedback from some parents suggesting they would still like to upload work as it will motivate their children to complete tasks. This is absolutely fine. However, I will only be checking Seesaw once a day during the time I will be marking books of the children in school.

Our communication is going to be significantly reduced compared with last term as we will no longer be calling on a weekly basis to check-in. However, if you have a concern please let me know via Seesaw, or by emailing Mrs. Harrison at [office@dundry.com](mailto:office@dundry.com) and she will inform me that I must call you. If something is urgent please call the Office.

Finally, I'd like to take the time to thank each and every one of you for all the work you have done over the past term. You have all set out to complete learning in a way which works for your family and the quality and amount of work completed was incredible. What was asked of you as home educators was extremely challenging, but you have all handled it superbly. Once again, you have proved what the Dundry community is capable of. On behalf of all of the staff associated with Oak Class I would like to say well done and thank you. We are truly grateful for what you have done; it will have made a huge difference to your child's education.

## Further Information on the Timetable

- Optional Worship/Reflection Time - Using your workbook you might want to write down a reflection on how you're feeling; write a prayer for the day, or write about what Christian value gave you support yesterday. You could also express this how you like in a different medium. E.g. Read a poem, drawing etc.
- Maths - The expectation for Term 6 is the same as last term in that you should be working during your maths session for 45-60 minutes. Your first task will be to complete the set challenge from the day's PowerPoint slides. All the worksheets and links required are on the PowerPoint and on the Oak Class web page. If this is completed with time to spare, or if you can't get it to work, you can select from:
  1. Year group extension booklets

Just like last term, there are extension packs for you should you need more. The ones from last term can still be used should you still have tasks you haven't completed, but on our website I will upload new Maths Booklets for Years 4, 5 and 6. These are great! You can print these out and work on them (there are written instructions for every method) or you can write them into your blank book or on paper. Desperately need it printed to write on? Get in touch and I will see what we can do to help you.
  2. ISeeMaths investigation task:

These investigations will be of a similar layout to what you are used to - in that a video of what to do appears and then you complete the work from that. But, you will have the option to write the workings out on a page of your blank workbook at home, or if you'd prefer, you can print out the workings sheet available with each video. ISeeMaths will give you the opportunity to use a skill you already have in a deeper way. **Top Tip - Got a sibling in KS2? Work on a challenge for the youngest person's year group and help each other.** Complete any investigation, puzzle or game you like, it doesn't have to be the one for the current day. ### 3. Complete remaining CGP Workbook Pages.

Using the books you already have, either fill in page you feel are capable of doing, or look at the archived videos for pages you may have missed out on last term.

If it took 45 minutes to 1 hour to complete the set work, you have done enough. Don't stress; it's just maths!

#### Arithmetic Friday

During Arithmetic Friday on a normal school day, we get lots of arithmetic calculations which cover all parts of Maths and we practice them because: 'if you don't use it, you lose it.' The following website: <https://www.mathsbox.org.uk/homeskills.html> has sets of 20 questions followed by answers so that you can check how you got on. Each Friday, have a look at the questions on your year group (or a higher year group if you fancy a challenge) and give yourself 30 minutes to complete - on the sheet if you can print, or in your workbooks/ on paper. Then press answers to mark it using your purple pen to check how you got on. (The support button links to something else so don't click that.) Want something similar for another time? If you would prefer to complete Arithmetic Friday instead of the MAT set work then that's fine.

- English - The expectation for Term 6 is the same as last term in that you should be working during your English session for 45-60 minutes. Your first task will be to complete the set challenge from the day's PowerPoint slides. All the worksheets and links required are on the PowerPoint and on the Oak Class web page. The slides will contain writing, comprehension or SPAG.

If this is completed with time to spare, or if you can't get it to work, you can complete remaining spelling pages in your CGP Grammar book.

- Reading and Comprehension - Time to read your book, and time to complete a comprehension from the pack. If you already completed a comprehension activity as part of the MAT learning slides, don't do another one here unless you want to.
