

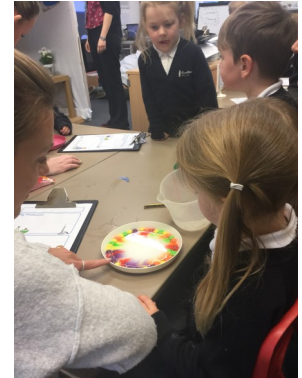


## HEAD OF SCHOOL UPDATE

This week we have been celebrating British Science week with a focus on science, technology, engineering and maths.

Our week began with an inspirational launch assembly delivered by Dr. Foster from Camborne Science and International Academy (CSIA). Dr. Foster shared her passion for science and inspired the children and staff with how to get actively involved in science activities.

Following this assembly, the Year 6 children enjoyed a session with Mrs Gourley from CSIA. The session built on their prior learning about light, with the children investigating which materials light travels through, and how shadows are created. They also had the opportunity to see how a ray box works and shone torches through prisms to observe how white light is split. It was a very enjoyable and informative session.



Thank you to all of the parents and carers who were able to join us for our science morning this week. The children enjoyed sharing their learning with you and much fun was had by all.

Tickets will be available for the children to purchase on the last day of term, 5th April, at 20p per ticket, up to a maximum of 10 tickets per child.

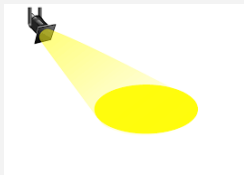
The draws will be held in classes during the school day.

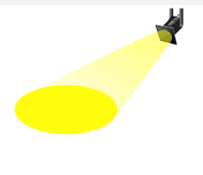
Our school target for attendance is 96%.
