It has been a busy week and I am delighted to say that having received our Key Stage 2 SATs results we have significantly improved in all areas which is summarised in the table below.

It is great to see that we are above the National average in both maths and English grammar, punctuation and spelling and closing the gap in English reading and English writing. Well done to all the year 6 pupils who have demonstrated a lot of resilience throughout this year and an "I can do it attitude" which makes a great recipe for success. I am sure they will take this with them on to Kingdown. A special thank you to Mrs Walker for her persistent determination and the team around her who provided a lot of support and intervention during the year.

Please can you check your child's bag for their end of year report which comes out today. This is followed by parents' evening on Monday from 3.00 – 6.00pm. If you have not yet made an appointment for this, it is not too late. It is vital to your child's education that parents discuss their child's progress this year with their class teacher. This is to support them further as they move through the school and prepare them for secondary education.

On Tuesday 10th July, Otter Class visited the Hawk Conservancy Trust near Andover. After a quick briefing from Michael, one of the falconers, the children experienced the feeding frenzy of 'The Vulture Restaurant.' Here, they learnt all about the role of vultures in cleaning up the environment, the dangers these comical birds face in modern times and the role the trust is playing in getting the public to appreciate vultures and put a halt to the steep decline in their numbers. We were all charmed by Delores and her jaunty jumps. The Wings of Africa flying display, gave the children an up-close-and-personal-experience, which they will surely never forget, as owls, ibis, storks, a fish eagle, kites and vultures swooped over their hastily bowed heads. We were in danger of losing hats and hair! Dr No – a rather determined secretary bird – demonstrated kicking skills that England strikers can only dream of, before we had an opportunity to explore the site and participate in the owl prowl. The sun shone brightly, the children were excellent ambassadors for the school and a grand day out was enjoyed by all.
