Summer Term - our first half-term topic is 'Good to be Green'

	<p>These are the two new sounds the children need to learn to recognise, say and read/write in words, then sentences. e.g. hear, fear, tear, dear, gear, near, year hair, chair, fair, pair, stair,</p> <p>(There are no actions for these sounds)</p>												
Monday	<p>Watch the video of Charlie and Lola 'I really wonder what plant I'm growing': https://www.dailymotion.com/video/x5jagl Using information you have learnt from the video, have a go at writing two or three sentences to tell people what they need to do to help plants grow.</p>												
Tuesday	<p>Please can you draw/make a flower on an A4 piece of paper with enough room round it for a bit of writing tomorrow.</p>

Thursday	<p>Make yourself a number line to 11 like this one:</p> <table border="1" data-bbox="448 1317 1347 1368"><tr><td>0</td><td>1</td><td>2</td><td>3</td><td>4</td><td>5</td><td>6</td><td>7</td><td>8</td><td>9</td><td>10</td><td>11</td></tr></table> <p>Use it to help you find 1 more/ 1 less than a number. Ask your grown up to challenge you e.g. what's 1 more than 7, 1 less than 6. When you're confident, try and do it without looking at the number line. Friday	<p>If you have a printer, print off the 'one more than, one less than' game (see the separate sheet) and play it with your family. Have a go at doing it without using your number line if you're confident. If you can't print off the game, take turns to roll a dice and say the number that is one more or one less than the number.</p>
