


# Newsletter

## Introducing our School's Christian Vision:

### 'Working Together, Valuing Everyone, Learning for Life'

The basis for our vision is The Parable of the Good Samaritan.

This parable underpins our ethos of love, respect, acceptance, religious tolerance, attitudes to people who are 'different', compassion, who is a 'neighbour' (including our global neighbours) and how we should we treat others.

**We believe that: At All Saints' we live out Christian values, with them being at the heart of everything we do; they shape the way in which we guide our children to become good citizens. We aim to develop 'aspirational lifelong learning' within a nurturing environment where everyone is valued and respected.**

### Learning about our Vision:

We are learning to do many things slightly differently due to Covid restrictions, one of which is not being able to gather together in the hall for Collective Worship assemblies. This has given us the opportunity to make a special time of the day in class, different to lessons, when we take 10-15 minutes to reflect and think about important issues and ideas.

During these class assemblies, we have introduced the children to our new school vision statement. Children have been encouraged to think about what **"working together, valuing everyone and learning for life"** means for each of us and how this might like to the parable of **The Good Samaritan**.
