Monday 22nd June	<p>You will receive an email from us with a <u>lot</u> of information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Our 'Welcome to Emscote' video, introducing you to some of our staff and outlining all the information we usually give during our Introductory Evening. -A 'Virtual Tour of Reception' PowerPoint for you to show your child, to help him/her picture school.
