- Coventry/Warwickshire agreed SACRE units.
- The Agreed Syllabus sets out what pupils should be taught in religious education (RE) from ages 3-19.
- All maintained schools have a statutory duty to provide a broad and balanced curriculum which includes RE. Maintained schools without a religious character are required to teach RE to all registered pupils in accordance with the locally Agreed Syllabus.
- It is a legal requirement for the Local Authority to review the Agreed Syllabus every 5 years.
- The Syllabus for Warwickshire and Coventry schools was published in 2017.
