

English

Children will be exploring a range of texts and will include:

- Revision and preparation for SATS: grammar, punctuation & spelling, and reading comprehension.
- Narrative- stories that raise issues ('outsiders').
- Narrative Poetry- learn and perform a poem, including looking at The Highwayman.
- Non-Chronological reports.
- Reading and comprehension activities.
- Spelling revision from Yr 6 word lists and looking at common exception words.
- Use all punctuation at the expected standard for Yr 6.
- Understand and demonstrate grammatical terms at the expected standard for Yr 6.

Science- Light

Children will learn to:

- recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light
- notice that light is reflected from surfaces.
- recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes
- recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object
- find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change
- use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye
- explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes
- use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

PE Children will take part in:

- Ball games including tennis, rounders and cricket.
- Athletics and orienteering activities.


