Learning Corner

Badgers:

We've been learning about King Alfred the Great this week in history, considering was he really 'great'? In Maths, year 5 have been learning about square and cubed numbers – ask your child to square all the numbers up to 12 and to cube the numbers up to 5. They have also been using their understanding of converting metric units to help with problem solving.

Year six are gearing up to sitting their SATS next week. In Maths, they have been going through past papers to analyse questions and improve their exam technique.

In RE we have been considering the story of "The Fall" – what happened to Adam and Eve and why.

Year 4 maths - This week we have been learning how to interpret and present data onto time graphs. We have been presenting 2 sets of data onto times graphs and grouped bar charts as-well-as revising our roman numerals and all of the statistic work we have learnt so far this term.

Foxes:

In maths this week, we have been learning about subtraction. Year 2 have been subtracting two 2 digit numbers whilst year 3 have been recapping column subtraction with exchanges.

In English, we have written another recount of our bank holiday weekend. Year 2 have also been working hard on their comprehension skills in preparation for SATs.

Otters:

This week in English we completed our postcards to Mrs Godfrey. We found lots of capital letters in the school address. The Foundation Stage children also decorated and wrote in their independent writing diaries. In maths we used our number bond and double facts to help us add a single digit to a 2 digit number. The younger children practised recognizing their numbers and then counting in 10s and 5s to group objects when working with large numbers. On Tuesday afternoon we completed our paintings and drawings of everyday flowering plants. We have been working hard to remember their names.
