Well done to our running superstar Amber, who was the first girl across the line in the Year 3 / 4 Cross Country event at Chew Valley last week!



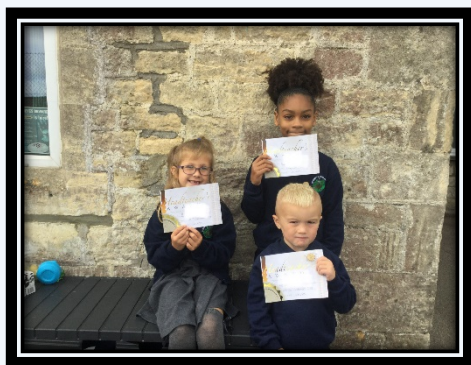
