RE Belonging

Topic Theme and Overview

This unit of work discusses the importance of belonging. It looks at how Christians show they belong and show their sense of community. It discusses symbols of Christianity and the key elements of Christian worship. It discusses the different artefacts in a church and how they are used to show belonging.

Learning outcomes:

All children will: talk about what belonging means to them and to Christians and how they express their sense of community and identity through worship; describe some of the key elements of Christian worship.

Most children will: explain the importance of worship for Christians; make connections between their own experience and Christian beliefs about belonging, community and identity.

Some children will: explain the symbolism of different artefacts and items in church and relate to own experience of visiting a church.

Tasks/activities informed by National Curriculum:

- The children will look at what it means to belong and what shows we belong to a group/family/club.
- They will discover artefacts inside a church and talk about what they are for and why they are important to Christians.
- Children will find out how Christians show their sense of belonging through worship.
- They will relate what we find out to our own experiences of visiting a church.
- They will find out how Christians show they belong to Christianity.
