Topic Theme and Overview:

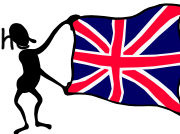

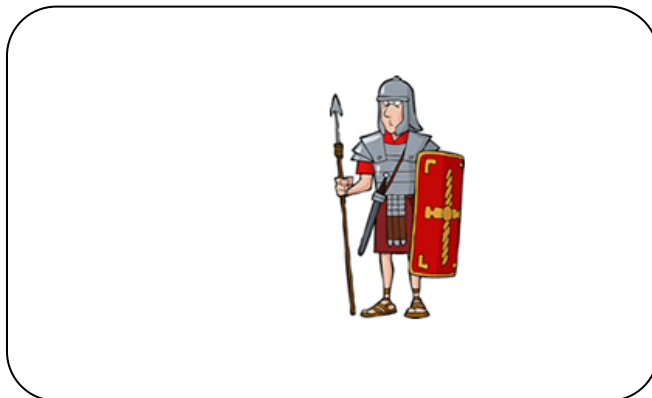
