The service is free and confidential. We also support children and young people with special educational needs or disabilities up to the age of 25.

This can include:

- explaining how the special educational needs 'system' works
- listening to your concerns
- helping you to express your views
- helping you to prepare for meetings
- helping you understand the paperwork
- helping explore the options for a child or young person's education
- putting you in touch with other support organisations

6 week (termly) sessions

Hippotherapy is subsidised by charitable donations and grants and 'partners' with families in the cost.

Cost: £6.00 annual membership

Subsidised cost: £130 per term

Cost: £55.00 - If an assessment and 'taster' session is required by families prior to commitment (this is then deducted from the full fee of £130 when proceeding with the full term - missed sessions are not refundable).

Suitability - Any child 6 months -18 years with complex motor neurone disability/syndrome, requires an assessment to ensure the activity is one which will benefit the child, taking into account their medical condition. This assessment is by an HPC registered chartered physiotherapist, specialist paediatric neuro-developmental area and certified in hippotherapy.

There is wheelchair accessibility but ability to weight bear with assistance/support is required. The assessment will also give an indication of individual approach and input required to maximize the positive impact of Hippotherapy.
