Topic Project Activities

Complete the following activities:

1. How tall can you grow a bean? The children will bring home a bean kit with a bean, compost and a pot. Plant the bean and see how tall it will grow.
2. Make a junk model of the giant in the story Jack and the Beanstalk. You can use all the boxes and tubes that you usually recycle. It can be painted or covered in paper. You could use wool for hair. Perhaps you could draw a plan. You could see if you could make the arms or legs move!

The children can have some fun at home with you writing stories – perhaps they could write a story in the style of Jack and the Beanstalk where the hero goes on a journey finds a monster to defeat.

Multiple Choice Spellings.

Choose a word to learn, write out three spellings of the word, one correct, one obviously wrong and one nearly correct. Ask your child to circle the correct spelling of the word.

For example – 1. wos 2. was 3. wit
Correct spelling 2

Look Cover Write Game

1. Look at the word and say the letters.
2. Try to remember the letters in the correct order.
3. Cover the word and try to write the word spelling it correctly.
4. Check to see if you have spelt the word Correctly.
5. Repeat 3 times.

Word search

Place games such as boggle or Junior Scrabble or use magnetic letters to help your child learn to spell different words.

Using magnetic letters pick out 10 letters containing a mixture of the correct letters and some incorrect letters. Ask your child to pick out the correct letters in the correct order to spell the word. Repeat using different words.
