



PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING 2016-2017 STOKE GABRIEL

Purpose of Funding

The government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education and sport in primary schools over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. The extra funding is allocated directly to primary head teachers, carrying on the sporting legacy of the Olympics.

Schools can choose how they use the funding, for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs e.g. Change4Life clubs
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools
